

The Robert P. King for a Lightship.

KINGSTON, Mass., Oct. 20.—Capt. Parker J. Hall, who was acquitted of the charge of murder at Long Island City Wednesday, has contracted with the Government to use his schooner, the Robert P. King, for a lightship. Capt. Hall will command the King, which will be stationed off Long Island and soon.

LONG ISLAND CITY, Oct. 20.—Capt. Parker J. Hall of the schooner Robert P. King, who was acquitted of the charge of murdering Frank Duard, one of his crew, applied to District Attorney Noble for permission to go before the Grand Jury to secure the indictment of Charles Duard, a brother of Frank, on a charge of assault with intent to kill.

When the District Attorney called for Capt. Hall to go before the Grand Jury, a little later in the day, the Captain could not be found,

More Records Made at Waltham.

WALTHAM, Mass., Oct. 20.—Wonderful time was made here to-day by the bicycle cracks, Tyler and Porter placing the most desirable records to their credit. Porter's work shows him to be the king of the Class A riders. He lowered the Class A mile mark, flying start, from 1:58 1-5 to 1:52 3-5, and beat Davidson's half-mile record by over a second, his time being 0:59. His intermediate times in the mile trial were: Quarter, 0:27 2-5; third, 0:36 1-5; half, 0:55; two-thirds, 1:15; three-quarters, 1:24. These are all records. Tyler just tried for the half-mile, flying-start record. He did the quarter in 0:25 2-5, the third in 0:34 2-5, and the half in 0:52 1-5. The last two are new records. Tyler also lowered the half-mile standing start mark to 0:57. McDuffee and "Riverside" Smith on a tandem rode a quarter in 0:26, and a third in 0:35, both of which are world records.
